Lake Superior Hiking Trail

A New Foley Adventure

Last summer six groups of Foley campers and counselors collectively hiked '79.9 miles from Two Harbors to Crosby Manitou State Park. They were the first groups to begin Foley's goal of hiking from Duluth, MN to the Canadian Border, a trail of

approximately 250 miles. For most of the length, the SHT is routed along the ridgeline overlooking Lake Superior. The terrain is variable from woodlands of birch, grassy clearings, to rivers, waterfalls and deep gorges. Foley campers put on their backpacks, filtered their own water, cooked over a compact stove and ate out of a Sierra cup. They worked as a team. Upon their return, they signed the official map and received a



The Fabulous Foley Fair





Developmental Assetsin the Camp Foley Community

In collaboration with the theories and ideas promoted by the Minneapolis-based Search Institute's Developmental Assets, we are continually adapting our programs and activities to promote and advocate 'Healthy Communities – Healthy Youth'. 'Healthy Communities – Healthy Youth' is embedded in Search Institute's structure of developmental assets – 40 concrete, positive experiences and qualities that have an immense impact on young people's lives. The 40 assets include external assets, related to outside support, empowerment, boundaries and expectations, and constructive use of time; and internal assets, such as commitment to learning, positive values, social competencies, and positive identity.

The research conducted by the Search Institute has demonstrated that these assets are significant on adolescent behavior. The more assets young people have, the less likely they are to encounter a wide range of problem behaviors. These asset-rich youth will then in turn grow-up to be strong, caring, healthy adults.

At Foley, your child is a part of the camp community and we are doing our part to assist him or her in becoming caring and responsible individuals. Our staff training reflects our commitment to this belief. We train our staff with the theories and ideals of the Developmental Assets and how to implement these philosophies into everyday activities and cabin living. Within the training, our counselors are instructed on how to promote relationships, accountability, and positive attitudes and choices within the camp community.

At the very start of the session, campers are welcomed into their cabin with a theme established by the cabin counselors. This theme helps to establish community and unite the individuals into a more cohesive group. On the very first night, campers are encouraged to create goals that pertain to their activities, behavior and choices. These goals are revisited throughout the session so campers can evaluate and reflect upon their progress all the while our staff are serving as mentors and cheerleaders encouraging campers to strive for their personal best.

The everyday activities involve more than just doing a skill and achieving an award. Campers are supported and challenged to try new things and learn new skills and are empowered as they reach their goals. Cabin life is filled with activities that affirm and nurture positive identity as well as help develop social competencies and relationship building.

All in all, Foley is more than activities and living in a cabin. There is the 'hidden curriculum' that we are trying to instill in each of our campers before they leave us at the end of their session. All components of the camp experience are touched upon by the Developmental Assets and how they can help your child grow and develop.

The 2nd Year Hesitant Camper

Bob Ditter is a licensed clinical social worker specializing in child, adolescent, and family therapy. He is well-known in the camping community having worked in numerous camps and given seminars and trainings to camp directors and camp counselors.

Many kids have second-year hesitations when it comes to camp. This is from both resident and day camps alike, all around the country.

There are several explanations for this display of sudden hesitation. Some children worry that the coming year won't be as good as their first year, while others are just having a little bout of the ambivalent blues. (You know. "I love it; I hate it"). The most probable explanation comes from understanding that children, especially younger children, are very much "creatures of the immediate moment." When they are at home, contemplating another separation from Mom and Dad and the safe surroundings of the familiar, they can't, in that moment, imagine leaving and being at camp. Once there, caught up in the fun and friendship of the camp experience, they can't remember, in that moment, a time when they didn't ever want to be here. This phenomenon is observed every day by pre-school and kindergarten teachers who must reassure nervous parents that, indeed, while their child is screaming bloody murder right now, literally two minutes after the parent leaves, that same child will act as if there never really was a big deal about being left at school!

I would suggest that the parents use what I call the "feel, felt, found" approach. Have them tell their children it is normal to feel the way they do; lots of kids have felt that way and have had second thoughts and worry it won't be as fun as last year; but what we have found is that once kids get there and start doing all the fun things, they love it all over again! See how that works. It usually does.


Hall of Fame and Bridge Crossing

The tuition fee covers the full program including all candy and pop (soda) treats and the memory book. Late fees will be charged at 1.5% per month.

Cancellation or Withdrawals

Prior to March 1, \$100 cancellation fee will be retained. From March 1 to May 1, \$300.00 cancellation fee will be retained. From May 1 up to 30 days from the start of camper's session, \$600.00 will be retained. A cancellation within 30 days of the start of the session will forfeit full tuition. No adjustment in tuition is made for late arrival, early departure, or dismissal.

Other Optional Expenditures:

Canteen (Camp Store): Optional expenses average about \$30.00 for one week, \$55.00 for two or more weeks, and \$100.00 for foreign campers. Available items include camp apparel, toiletry articles, film, stamps, stationery, water bottles, fun items, etc. Other items charged to this account are outgoing faxes, prescription medication, and rental of blankets, pillows and sleeping bags.

Riding: Campers going into 4th grade or above can sign-up for three one hour lessons, beginning level, Western riding taking place at Trout Lake Camp, one mile from Foley. Cost is \$40.00.

Golf: Campers going into 6th grade or above may sign-up for 1 to 3 games of golf on an executive, 9-hole course at Emily Greens. Clubs, balls and a treat are included. Limited instruction is given by a Foley counselor. Cost is \$23.00 per game.

Fishing Guide Trip: Campers going into 6th grade or above may sign up to go out with a professional fishing guide for three hours in his boat. Rods and bait are included and a Foley counselor goes with the group. Cost is \$30.00 per three hour trip. Campers can sign up once or twice for this experience.

<u>Transportation to and from Minneapolis</u>: There is an estimated one way cost of \$35.00 including lunch or snack.

Overnight Accommodations in Minneapolis, if necessary, average about \$40.00 per night not including food.

Only those services actually used or items purchased will be charged. At the close of the season, parents will be billed or refunded for expenditures in the camp store or adjustments in the above services. Late fees will be charged at 1.5% per month.

Campers are encouraged to ride on our special buses as an aid to their camp adjustment. At the beginning of the session, our buses leave from Our Lady of Grace Church parking lot in Edina, MN off Highway 100, at 5051 Eden Ave. at 10:30 a.m. At the end of the session, the camp buses will return to the same location around 12:30 p.m. Parents can drop campers off at camp between 1:00 & 2:00 p.m. and pick them up between 9:00 & 10:00 a.m.

Kathy Monson at Travel One, 1-800-245-1111, will coordinate flights to and from the Minneapolis St. Paul International Airport. More information will be sent to you in early spring. However, parents/ guardians may book flights on any airlines so that arrival in Minneapolis is before 9:30 a.m. and departure is after 2:00 p.m. Parents are responsible for paying in advance unaccompanied minor fees. Campers will be met as flights arrive and will be bused directly to camp. If necessary, supervised lodging can be arranged for campers needing to fly the night before to connect with camp transportation. The 2nd Year Hesitant Camper

Bob Ditter is a licensed clinical social worker specializing in child, adolescent, and family therapy. He is well-known in the camping community having worked in numerous camps and given seminars and trainings to camp directors and camp counselors.

Many kids have second-year hesitations when it comes to camp. This is from both resident and day camps alike, all around the country.

There are several explanations for this display of sudden hesitation. Some children worry that the coming year won't be as good as their first year, while others are just having a little bout of the ambivalent blues. (You know, "I love it; I hate it"). The most probable explanation comes from understanding that children, especially younger children, are very much "creatures of the immediate moment." When they are at home, contemplating another separation from Mom and Dad and the safe surroundings of the familiar, they can't, in that moment, imagine leaving and being at camp. Once there, caught up in the fun and friendship of the camp experience, they can't remember, in that moment, a time when they didn't ever want to be here. This phenomenon is observed every day by pre-school and kindergarten teachers who must reassure nervous parents that, indeed, while their child is screaming bloody murder right now, literally two minutes after the parent leaves, that same child will act as if there never really was a big deal about being left at school!

I would suggest that the parents use what I call the "feel, felt, found" approach. Have them tell their children it is normal to feel the way they do; lots of kids have felt that way and have had second thoughts and worry it won't be as fun as last year; but what we have found is that once kids get there and start doing all the fun things, they love it all over again! See how that works. It usually does.
