

About the Race

The Camp Foley Triathlon is the perfect event to reconnect with camp friends in the spirit of competition while running, biking and canoeing.

Participants and their families are invited to spend the night (in Foley's cabins or at local hotels) and relive your camp memories while feasting at a banquet on Saturday evening and a Sunday brunch (complete with soda bread).

Make history and join us for another Foley First! Our goal is to provide you with an enjoyable triathlon experience and plenty of time to reconnect with camp friends.

When & Where

Saturday & Sunday, September 18 & 19, 2010. Directions can be found on our website.

Event Proceeds

Proceeds raised from this event will go towards Camp Foley's Scholarship Fund with checks being written to ACA Scholarship Program. We appreciate the efforts to make a camping experience possible for future Foley campers who otherwise could not attend.

Divisions

Participants may compete as part of a two person team or as an individual and we will find you a canoeing partner.

Two person teams can choose to canoe together and both do the running and biking or do it as a relay with one biking and one canoeing. Or they can canoe together and one person can be off running and biking.

Awards

All triathlon participants attending the awards ceremony will have an opportunity to win a grand prize drawing of one week of camp tuition in 2011.

Awards will be presented to winners with divisions being determined in the spring as we get a feel for the number and ability of registrants.

Kid's Races

Races and events of varying levels for kids of all ages will be held on Saturday. Including "The Foley Green Sprint & Wiggle" (5 yrs & younger), "The Foley Loop & Obstacle" (6-11 yrs), and "The Junior Tri-Two Mile Run & Field Challenge" (11-13 yrs).

Triathlon Race Course

The race course is a short course that allows for people of all athletic abilities to participate. With options available to do parts of the race, we hope you will at least join us for one or two of the legs.

Canoeing

This is a two person effort where you will canoe approximately 2 miles (wind dependent). Pairs will be placed in heats according to their estimated canoeing ability. Only two people per canoe are allowed and lifejackets must be worn. The canoeing pair can be two triathlon participants or a person who only competes in this event. Foley will provide canoes and paddles.

Biking

The bike course will be 10 miles conquering the hills and curves on CR 134, out to Highway 1 and east to The Ole Grade Road and back to Foley. All cyclists must observe MN traffic laws. Certified hard-shelled bike helmets are required. No listening devices are allowed. Drafting is prohibited.

Running

The running course will be 3 miles going west of camp on a paved road encompassing a loop and returning to the same spot. Listening devices are strongly discouraged on the course.
