

We often hear people tell us that they tried to refer a new family, but the parents have a few reservations about summer camp. Here are two of the most common concerns and how you can help minimize them:

"How can you let your kids go away for two weeks? Don't they miss you? Don't you miss them?" Of course campers miss their parents and parents miss their kids - but that's healthy! On his website, Michael Thompson, PhD says, "But a parent's first instinct - to shelter their offspring above all else - actually deprives children of the major developmental milestones

that occur through letting them go - and watching them come back transformed." We recommend reading his book, Homesick and Happy.

"I don't think I can go a whole two weeks without talking to my kid on the phone." To this we say, "sure you can!" We recommend practicing before camp. Try having your child spend a weekend away from home without calling to speak directly to your child!

"Camp is so far away from our hometown. It would be better for my kids to just go to a local camp." A camp a few hours by car doesn't seem much closer than a camp that's an airplane ride away once your child is gone. In both cases, parents aren't able to see their child or speak to them. Campers that go far from home have a sense of accomplishment and independence!

# Building Brains at Camp



Tina Payne Bryson, PhD and co-author of The Whole-Brain Child, was interviewed for the January/ February issue of Camping magazine in an article "Bunks are Good for the Brains: The Neuroscience of Sleepaway Camp." It's a very interesting interview to read as it explains how summer camp not only

influences the minds of children but can actually reconstruct their brains.

In the interview, Payne Bryson talks about the part of the brain that is most affected by a child's experience at summer camp: the middle prefrontal cortex (behind the forehead, front-most part of the frontal lobe). This is the part of the brain that regulates the body and emotions and allows us to feel empathy, bounce back after failure, make thoughtful choices and overcome fear.

According to Payne Bryson, "Experience changes the brain." What children experience at camp, particularly the emotional and challenging experiences are important to the development of children's brains. Like any muscle, when used, the brain grows and strengthens. The things campers experience at camp (overcoming fears, handling emotions away from parents, mastering a new skill, building relationships, etc.) exercise the brain to build a stronger brain.

Yes, children can, and do, have similar experiences at home (in school, sports and after school activities), but the summer camp setting is especially unique because it's also centered on having fun. Payne Bryson says, "Kids are willing to work harder and tolerate more frustration and setbacks

# because they're having a good time doing it, and they're doing it in the context of relationships."

Campers see their friends and peers pushing through. Counselors and staff members empathize with each camper's struggles but still encourage them to push through and endure. Campers then face their challenges and persist through. Payne Bryson goes on to say that, "This is one of the ways 'grit' is built in the brain." We love having the opportunity to build grit!

Through our staff training, camp policies and schedule and programming, we've created an environment that is not only fun for campers but is thoughtfully planned to ben-

To read the entire interview, visit <u>acacamps.org/camp-</u> mag/1401/bunks-good-brains. We also encourage parents to read Panye Bryson's The Whole-Brain Child co-authored with Dan Siegel. The book provides 12 key strategies to foster brain development.

In the book Payne Bryson and Siegel explain how the

"upstairs brain" is forming until a person's mid-20s. So for children, younger children particularly, the right, "emotional" brain rules over the left, "logical" brain. The book helps parents understand what's happening with their children and how to respond in a way that integrates and develops different parts of the brain. It explains how the structure of the mind can affect behavior, which helps children understand their own behavior. The book uses science and anecdotes to teach parents and help children become calmer and happier.

# Summer Service

Each summer Camp Foley works hard to be a positive member of the Brainerd Lakes Area community. In 2014, we were involved in two community service efforts and had campers run in four different 5k races!

### Invasive Species

This summer, small groups of campers and a staff member went to a boat landing on Trout Lake to inspect incoming and outgoing boats for aquatic invasive species (AIS). It was the job of a counselor and the campers to okay the boats entering or exiting the lake. Our Foley representatives would inspect boats and talk to boat owners about a variety of AIS, specifically Eurasian Milfoil and Zebra Mussels. Four Foley staff members were trained by the local DNR (Department of Natural Resources) to conduct the checks with the help of campers. The DNR provided a checklist to use when inspecting boats. The list included things like lifting the prop up and down, emptying live-wells and removing plugs from boats. 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

# New Ideas: Camperships.com

We're not the only camp trying to offer camperships! <u>Camperships.com</u> is providing an easy way for all camps to help out families with financial burdens. We're hoping to find some campers for 2014 through this website.

Camperships.com might be best described as the match.com (a dating website) of the camping world. Families fill out a form describing their child, what type of camp they are looking for and how much money they can feasibly spend on a summer camp. Camps also fill out a profile about the type of camp they are, what types of activities are offered and the ages of the campers that attend.

After a camp completes its profile, it is presented with a list of families that would be interested in what that camp has to offer. Camps can then browse through the families to find campers that fit into specific sessions that still have availability.

The nice thing about Camperships.com is that there is no fee that the family or the camp pays. It's just a way for camps to find new families to fill their program. Families don't have to agree to pay a specific amount, but they do agree to pay a nominal amount. According to the website, "Camperships.com is not about a totally free experience,

but about really helping every child experience camp." This directly supports the mission of Camp Foley's Scholarship Fund, which is to provide a camp experience to families who otherwise would not be able to afford it.

In a family's profile, it explicitly says what kind of financial commitment they wish to make to a camp and the financial commitment they could make to a camp. Camps can then offer a specific campership for the camper. If the family likes the camp and can afford to send their child with the camp's offer, they accept! If it's not the right fit, the families can decline offers as well.

Hopefully, this summer we will have the opportunity to extend an offer to a Camperships.com family!



# If You Donated Just \$10 ...

We say this often, but that's because it's true, every little bit counts. At the end of the summer in 2013 we had over 60 families donate their child's unused Special Canteen Funds, of any amount, which totaled over \$2,000.
