

THEME DAYS are planned to add fun, creativity and a little extra to camper's camping experience. Check the calender for the scheduled activities on various sessions.

"Big Camper, Little Camper" - Campers from the Sioux Tribe (ages 13-16) will be paired up with campers from the Chippewa Tribe (ages 6-12) for a fun day they will share as duo. Events may include being meal-time partners, a scavenger hunt, making friendship bacelets, going to free swim together or participating in a variety of activities during the day.

"Summer Halloween" and Dance - Bring or make at camp a Halloween costume for this festive dance. A costume contest, haunted house, writing spooky stories and bobbing for apples are a few of the events that may happen.

"Burbs, Hicks, and Slicks" - Cabinmates will play both city and country games like kick the can, roller skating, stick ball, hide and seek, hay rides and water or mud fights. Old, grubby clothes that can get stained are a must for this day. Bring your roller skates.

"Bizzare Record Breaking" - By rotating through different stations, campers attempt to make Foley history by setting new records in events like fish catching, free throws, watermellon seed spitting, long jumping, the longest stare...the events are numerous.

SWIM TEST NEWS

Every camper that has been to Foley in the past is familiar with the memorable swim test on the first day of arrival at camp. The swimming program is not only tradition, but a way to promote a valuable lifetime skill and maintain safety on the waterfront. Because campers typically spend at least half of their day at camp on or near the lake, testing gives us the security of knowing if they have the strength and composure to handle themselves in an emergency situation. Providing swimming instruction has two other benefits; it enhances the child's ablility and helps improve their coordination.

For those reasons, we test campers to either pass them out of swimming lessons or place them in the appropriate class according to their skill level. We are currently in the process of restructuring the testing proceedure which will allow us to be more efficient in establishing the abilities of our campers.

In order for a camper to test out of swim lessons, they must possess Red Cross intermediate swimming skills. The swim test will include a five minute treading water to evaluate endurance and a stroke check. There are five strokes that will be tested; the front crawl, elementary backstroke, sidestroke, breaststroke and back crawl. In order for a camper to pass out of swim lessons, they must complete the five-minute tread and be able to demonstrate complete proficiency in three out of the five strokes. Campers must also show adequate ability in the other two strokes.

Starting next summer, all campers who have been to Foley in the past and have passed the intermediate skills test will not be required to take the swim test again. Everyone else who has not completed that level of swimming at Camp Foley, both new and returning campers, will be tested. Notes from swim coaches and copies of certifications from other aquatic facilities will be taken into advisement in evaluating camper's swimming abilities. We encourage parents and campers to send {copies of awarded certifications to the camp office before the camper arrives. This prevents the originals from getting lost or damaged.



Summer Survey Results!

We would like to thank everyone who completed a survey at the beginning of last year's camping season. The information gathered helps us evaluate our services to our camp families. Out of 255 forms mailed, 101 were returned to us. Here are some of the results of the survey:

- 1. Camp families chose a particular session for their child because:
 - 32% Timing fits into summer plans
 - 26% Friends attend same session
 - 24% Length of stay
 - 15% Same session as last year
- 2. Families first heard about Camp Foley from:
 - 31% Parent's friends/neighbors
 - 24% School friends
 - 20% Family member(s) are Foley or Wabigoniss alumni
 - 15% Relatives
- 3. The most important factor why families chose Foley was:
 - 59% Activities/programs offered

29% Friends

6% Living experience

12% Location

- 6% Size of camp
- 4. Factors that were most helpful in selecting Camp Foley were:
 - 37% The recommendation of another family
 - 17% Personal contact with Director or administrative staff
 - 16% Camp Brochure
 - 15% Promotional Video
- 5. Concerning mailings, camp families felt:
 - 89% The amount of mailings were adequate
 - 9% Would like more
 - 2% Would like fewer mailings

It was exciting to actually verify the importance of friends, relatives or neighbors in the survey results listed above. Since the majority of our camp families heard about Foley from someone they knew, why not spread the word? Take a minute and ask "Do I know another child who would benefit from a camping experience at Foley?" Allow another child to feel the warm, caring environment that your family has come to know over the course of your association with Foley. Scholarship Program Successful!

















Lake Superior Sail Trip

Why an Accredited Camp?

Camp in an experience that molds and shapes one's future, one's life potential. Yet, more that 9,000 day and resident camps in the U.S., and others abroad, might seem a formidable array from which to choose. In addition, camps differ in style and approach, in the programs and activities they offer, in their facilities, level of staffing, even the food they serve. Selecting the right camp, thus, is often a matter of asking the right questions.

When you select an ACA accredited camp, you have the assurance that many of these important questions have already been asked and answered in ways that go beyond a shadow of a doubt to show you that the management of that camp cares. They care because they have agreed to the best kind of quality control in camping; ACA's camp accreditation program.

Accreditation is essentially a process of peer review and self examination whereby camp owner/operators agree to uphold and live up to a stringent code of camping professionals as basic to quality camping.

This code, known as ACA's camp standards, consists of nearly 300 items of concern that can be applied to any camp operation, in effect becoming questions directed toward owner/operators about their camp operations. These standards are continuously updated and evaluated to reflect the current state of the art of quality camping. Although many State and Federal laws and regulations govern overall environmental conditions, ACA's standards go a step further in addressing specific areas of programming, personnel and management practices that relate specifically to camping activities such as aquatics and tripping.

The quality difference with ACA's accreditation and standards program is that ACA is a voluntary organization of camping professionals who participate in these programs because they want to, who commit themselves among their colleagues, in word and deed, to quality camping.

Once every three years, a team of two or more trained camping professionals, known as visitors, visits and evaluates each camp to ensure that it complies with ACA's standards. The camp management, during the accreditation visit, must answer yes to 14 critical prerequisite standards in each category applicable to the camp, achieving an overall score of 80 percent.

The management of the camp seeking accreditation goes to considerable extent to earn this accreditation. Just as various trades and professionals display emblems showing they have met minimal requirements in order to practice in their field, the nation's day and resident camps have their mark of distinction, their benchmark of performance.

The ACA camp accreditation logo is your assurance that a camp is owned and operated by camp management committed to the highest standards established for the camping industry. In seeking accreditation, camp owner/operators make a statement about themselves and their camps that they are willing to have their operations scrutinized and reviewed by camping colleagues who know and value quality camping.





Throughout the years, Camp Foley has maintained a reputation for quality staff. This tradition of caring, talented and enthusiastic counselors has not been by accident. When we choose our staff, we are selecting adults who will be positive role models for young people. I personally have to be able to answer "yes" to the following question, "Would I trust this person with my own daughter in the camp environment?"

Did you know that before we hire a prospective staff member, they have:

*Completed an application.

*Had three reference forms completed by former employers or instructors which attests to their character.

*Completed a standardized personal interview.

- *Been assessed on their communication skills, personality, self-image, interpersonal skills, values, maturity and intellect.
- *Been found to have the initial knowledge, experience and abilities to instruct at least two activities taught at camp.

Did you know that when a staff member signs a contract, he or she signs a commitment to the values and philosophy of Camp Foley? For example a staff member will:

*Treat children as individuals by promoting self-esteem and self-reliance.

*Be caring, enthusiastic and creative.

*Put the camper before themselves.

*Always consider the safety and health of the campers.

*Be supportive of the religious philosophy of the camp.

*Discipline campers fairly and consistently using the guidelines established by Foley. *Practice the tradition of conservative dress codes and a neat, clean-cut appearance.

*Prepare by taking courses in Lifeguard Training, CPR, First Aid and other activity related areas.

*Collect materials such as stories, songs and games for the campers.

Did you know that each staff member completes an intensive training program at Camp Foley before the first campers arrive? This 10 or 11 day session is one of the longest training periods in comparison to other camps. Our staff:

*Actively rehearses all emergency procedures.

*Attend seminars on discipline, sexual abuse, age characteristics of campers, cabin living, health and safety, program planning, and the philosophy, goals and objectives of Camp Foley.

*Learn camp routines by actively participating in them as a camper would.

*Complete training seminars in at least two major activity areas.

*Receive written evaluations documenting their skills, ability to handle emergencies and strengths in working with campers.

Did you know that the supervisory staff, known as the Leadership Team, continuously evaluate and support each staff member through:

*Morning staff meetings.

*Weekly individual meetings.

*Personal evaluations of their instruction in activities and work in the cabin group.

Camp Is For Making Friends

One of the most frequently asked questions from parents of prospective campers is "Will my child be okay if he/she isn't coming to camp with a friend?

Yes! Every session many campers do venture to Foley without a friend for many different reasons.

Sometimes a camper may elect to have an independent experience away from school and neighborhood friends or the parents may want a camper to branch out and meet new people. Other reasons may include a family tradition of going to Foley, attending with a sibling or a scheduling conflict with friends.

Yes! Campers do make friends!

How do we at Foley provide campers with opportunities to make friends?

- 1) Foley will assist parents in arranging for children to meet, write or call another camper by providing phone numbers and addresses.
- 2) Prior to opening day, careful attention is given to composing cabin groups. One important consideration is creating a blend of campers conducive to formulating new friends.
- On the bus campers are introduced to others who are of similar age and many times to their cabinmates.
- 4) Cabin counselors personally welcome each camper upon arrival to camp and introduce them to their cabinmates. The first day is spent as a cabin unit getting acquainted and acclimated to camp life.
- 5) Each cabin participates in a variety of events actively involving the entire cabin.
- 6) Campers participate in an evening program stressing respect, acceptance and cooperation amongst all members of the group.
- 7) Many camp events foster friendship building including: camp banquets, friendship camp fire, autograph signing and dances.

As a young person between the age of 7 and 15, I experienced attending camp with and without a friend. My best experiences were when I independently ventured out and made long lasting "camp friends". I have strong memories of my parents trusting me to fly alone and to attend camp without a friend. This created a lasting feeling of independence and self-reliance. These successful experiences left me knowing that I was a very capable person. Most importantly, I made new friends in a new environment. As Director of Camp Foley; I repeatedly hear the tales from Foley campers of making special camp friends. These range from simple, "Don't worry Mom, I have a new friend," to complex explanations on camp friends. Remember, there is a special unique bonding between friendships established and rekindled at camp.



Camp Foley celebrates Earth Day everyday and has for many years. We have implemented practices at camp that campers and visitors may or may not realize are happening.





Program Growth

There are still strong groups from the surrounding areas of St. Louis and Chicago. It is exciting to have campers from across the United States.
