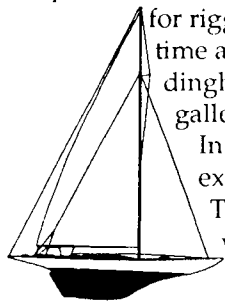

Lake Superior Sail Trip

Camp Foley will be offering Lake Superior Sail Trips during Sessions Two and Three. Participants in the four day sail trip will learn to safely crew and skipper a deep water cruising sailboat. Campers will be responsible



for rigging and unrigging the boat, spending time at the helm as skipper, participating in dinghy launching and landing, and sharing in galley duties.

In addition to the sailing, campers will explore some of the 22 Apostle Islands. These islands are rich in history and wildlife. Known for their hiking trails, lighthouses, and secluded wildlife habitat, the islands provide campers a unique opportunity to experience the beauty and history of a truly extraordinary part of our world. Indian settlements are believed to have been established on the islands as early as 4000 B.C. Remains of buildings used in the 17th century by fur traders can be seen on the islands.

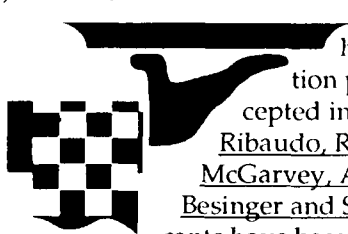

Camper Leadership Program

They also receive training and are given some basic responsibilities in aiding counselors of younger campers. When not working, CLPs participate in camp activities as would regular campers. It is a fantastic opportunity to meet new challenges, to learn how to work cooperatively in a group, to learn new skills in activities and to develop personal skills in communication, cooperation, and team building.

5th Grade - Extended overnight (4 meals) on Tepec Island

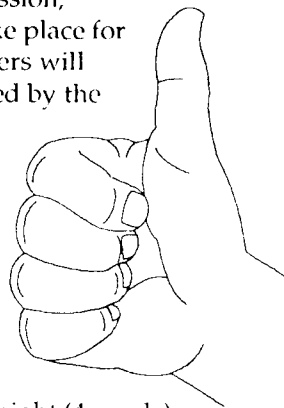
6th Grade - 3 day canoe trip down the Pine River

races with Camp Birchwood and a travelling trophy between the two camps.

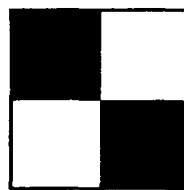
-New boardsailing class arrangements and additional smaller sails.

A Special Time For Families

Family Camp is for family members who want the excitement of sharing together in the numerous activities offered at Foley. Add the beautiful setting on Whitefish Lake, our enthusiastic and talented staff, and the Foley spirit and hospitality. Foley staff will supervise the safety on the riflery and archery ranges, pull skiers, skipper sailboats, and provide activity instruction upon request. The result is a fun filled, wonderful family vacation.

Accommodations/Meals:

Participants will sleep well in clean cabins used in our camp program. Each cabin can accommodate approximately nine people; in some buildings up to eighteen can be housed. Family friends may request shared living

quarters. There are centrally located washroom facilities. Three wholesome meals are served family style each day.

Dates/Costs/Registration:

A family may register to attend Family Camp from June 17 to June 23, opting to stay from one to seven days. The rate per day is \$45.00 per person or \$30.00 per child five and under. Extra charges are made for items purchased in our camp store and for ammunition used on the rifle range. Approximate arrival and departure times are requested to assist us in making your stay enjoyable. A \$25.00 deposit per person is requested.

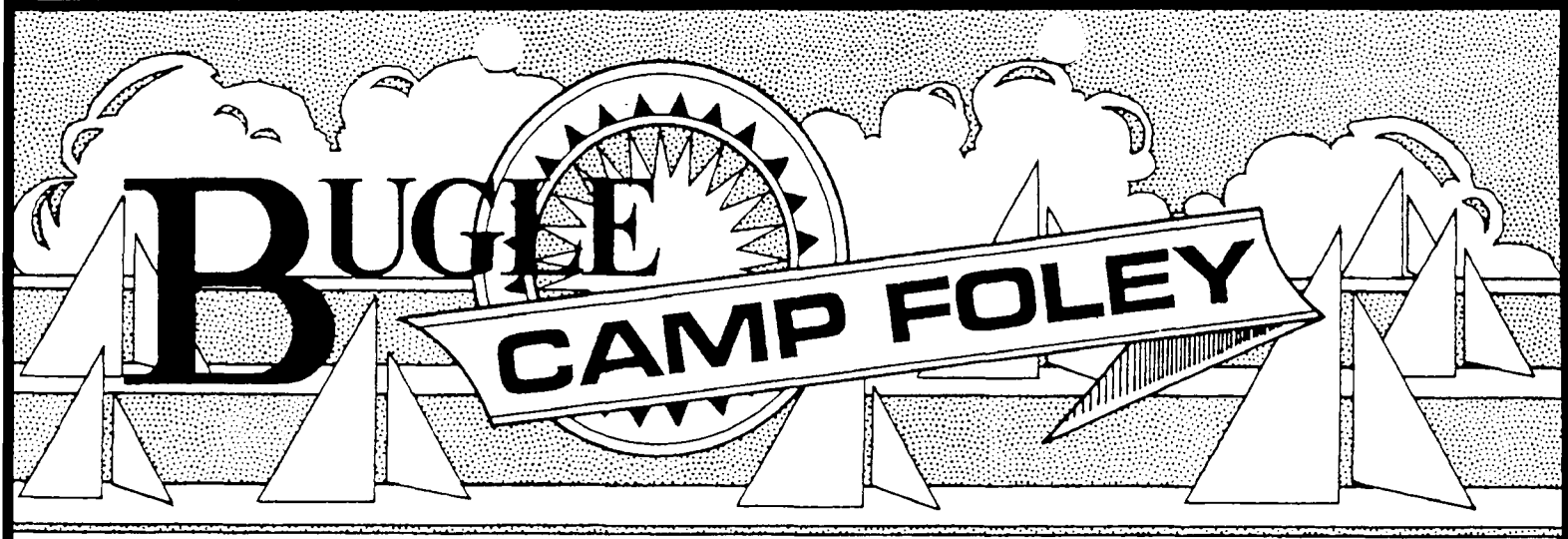

Coming to Camp - With or Without Friends?

One of the most frequently asked questions from parents of prospective campers is "Will my child be okay if he/she comes to camp without a friend?"

YES! Every session many campers do venture to Foley without a friend for many different reasons.

Sometimes a camper may elect to have an independent experience away from school and neighborhood friends or the parents may want a camper to branch out and meet new people. Other reasons may include a family tradition of going to Foley, attending with a sibling or a scheduling conflict with friends.

YES! Campers do make friends!

How do we at Foley provide campers with opportunities to make friends?

1. Foley will assist parents in arranging for children to meet, write or call another camper by providing phone numbers and addresses.

2. Prior to opening day, careful attention is given to composing cabin groups. One important consideration is creating a blend of campers conducive to formulating new friends.

3. On the bus campers are introduced to others who are of similar age and many times to their cabinmates.

4. Cabin counselors personally welcome each camper upon arrival to camp and introduce them to their cabinmates. The first day is spent as a cabin unit getting acquainted and acclimated to camp life.

5. Each cabin participates in a variety of events actively involving the entire cabin.

6. Campers participate in an evening program stressing respect, acceptance and cooperation amongst all members of the group.

7. Many camp events foster friendship building including: camp banquets, friendship campfire, autograph signing and dances.

As a young person between the ages of 7 and 15, I experienced attending camp with and without a friend. My best experiences were when I independently ventured out and made long lasting "camp friends". I have strong memories of my parents trusting me to fly alone and attend camp without a friend. This created a lasting feeling of independence and self-reliance. These successful experiences left me knowing that I was a very capable person. Most importantly, I made new friends in a new environment. As Director of Camp Foley, I repeatedly hear the tales from Foley campers of making special camp friends. These range from simple, "Don't worry Mom, I have a new friend," to complex explanations on the importance of camp friends. Remember, there is a special unique bonding between friendships established and rekindled at camp.

Quality Staff... A Camp Foley Tradition

Throughout the years, Camp Foley has maintained a reputation for quality staff. This tradition of caring, talented and enthusiastic counselors has not been by accident. When we choose our staff, we are selecting adults who will be positive role models for young people. I personally have to be able to answer "yes" to the following question, "Would I trust this person with my own daughter or son in the camp environment?"

Did you know that before we hire a prospective staff member, they have:

1. Completed an application.
2. Had three reference forms completed by former employers or instructors which attest to their character. Reference checks are also conducted.
3. Completed a standardized personal interview.
4. Been assessed on their communication skills, personality, self-image, interpersonal skills, values, maturity and intellect.
5. Been found to have the initial knowledge, experience and abilities to instruct in at least two activities taught at camp.

Did you know that when a staff member signs a contract, he or she signs a commitment to the values and philosophy of Camp Foley?

For example a staff member will:

1. Treat children as individuals by promoting self-esteem and self-reliance.
2. Be caring, enthusiastic and creative.
3. Put the camper before themselves.
4. Always consider the safety and health of the campers.
5. Be supportive of the religious philosophy of the camp.
6. Discipline campers fairly and consistently using the guidelines established by Foley.
7. Practice the tradition of conservative dress codes and a neat, clean-cut appearance.

8. Prepare by taking courses in Lifeguard Training, CPR, First Aid and other activity related areas.

9. Collect materials such as stories, songs and games for the campers.

Did you know that each staff member completes and intensive training program at Camp Foley before the first campers arrive? This 10 or 11 day session is one of the longest training periods in comparison to other camps. Our staff:

1. Actively rehearses all emergency procedures.
2. Attend seminars on discipline, sexual abuse, age characteristics of campers, cabin living skills, health and safety, program planning, and the philosophy, goals, and objectives of Camp Foley.
3. Learn camp routines by actively participating in them as a camper would during his or her stay.
4. Complete training seminars in a least two activity areas.
5. Receive written evaluations documenting their skills, ability to handle emergencies and strengths in working with campers.

Did you know that the supervisory staff continuously evaluate and support each staff member through:

1. Morning staff meetings.
2. Weekly individual meetings.
3. Personal evaluations of their instruction in activities and work in the cabin groups.

Staff are very important in providing our campers with a positive camping experience. They are an important element to the success of a cabin group or an activity. With all of this in mind, I continuously promise to keep our high standards of selecting and training the best possible staff for our campers. We, as Foley Staff, will take care of your child.

Meet Part of Our 1992 Staff

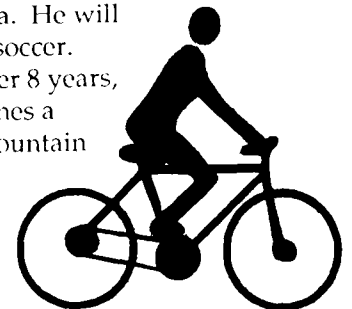

Health Care Personnel

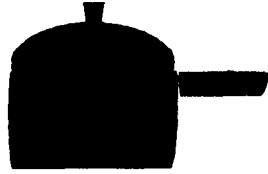

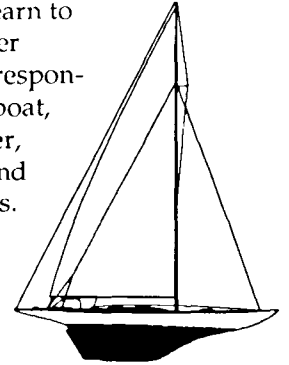
Dishwashers Needed! Ses. 1

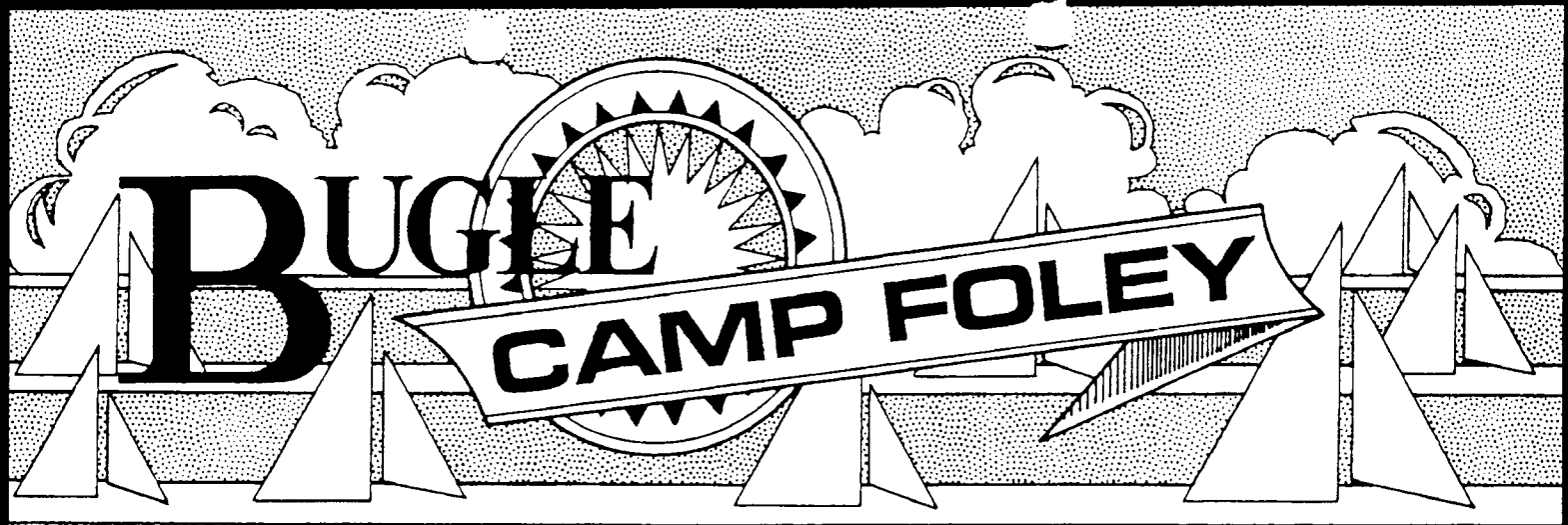

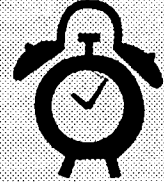

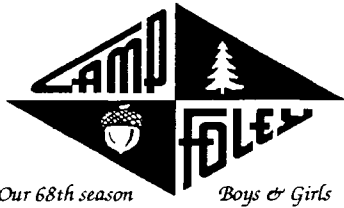

TRANSPORTATION - Parents are invited to bring their children to camp but are encouraged to send them on our special buses as a aid to their camp adjustment.

- At the beginning of the sessions on **Wednesday, June 24, July 1, July 8, and July 29**, our buses leave Our Lady of Grace Church parking lot, 5051 Eden Ave., Edina, at 10:30 a.m. (St. Cloud stop for lunch at approximately 11:30 a.m. will be made at McDonald's on Highway 10 and on the return trip between 11:00 and 11:30 a.m.).

- At the end of the sessions on **Tuesday, June 30, July 7, July 28, and August 18**, our buses from camp will arrive at Our Lady of Grace Church parking lot in Edina at approximately 12:30 p.m. If your son or daughter is to travel on our bus, merely indicate your desire in the space provided on the application form.

- Camp will coordinate flights to the Minneapolis/St. Paul International Airport. Special flight information will be sent as soon as the summer of 1992 schedules are available, however, parents may book flights on any airlines so that arrival in Minneapolis is before 10:00 a.m. and departure is after 2:00 p.m. Campers will be met as flights arrive and will be bused directly to camp. If necessary, supervised lodging will be provided overnight. We shall also provide a corresponding return service. Please use the luggage tags that will be sent to help identify Foley luggage. Use of duffle bags is requested. We assume no liability until the camper is under our supervision or after the camper leaves our supervision en route home.

HEALTH - Physical forms and health history forms are mailed upon receipt of registration. Physicals must be completed and signed by a licensed physician within 24 months of camp attendance. Anyone coming to camp without a medical form properly filled out will be charged accordingly for an examination by a local physician. (A photocopy of the camper's current school medical examination will be acceptable.) **All health histories must be completed yearly within 6 months of camp attendance.** Campers will be limited in their activities until this form is properly completed.

- A resident nurse is available to meet camper needs. The nurse will dispense only FDA medications that are in the original, labeled containers. Medical attention is available in Pine River and Brainerd.

- Parents are responsible for all expenses incurred by illness/accident of camper. Camp Foley does not carry individual camper medical insurance. This includes cost of transportation for medical reasons.

ACTIVITIES - Campers of all ages and abilities can participate in the major activities such as sailing, canoeing, swimming, archery, tennis, nature studies, soccer, group games, fishing, shop, and art. To participate in the following activities one must meet these minimum requirements:

All-terrain biking - tall enough to ride a 26" bike safely.

Boardsailing - Advanced beginner swimming skills, and strength to pull up the sail.

Diving - Advanced beginner swimming skills.

Rifery - Eight years of age or older.

Snorkeling - Advanced beginner swimming skills.

Trap Shooting - Twelve years of age or older.

Waterskiing - Intermediate swimming skills.

All activities are progressive and challenge both the beginner and advanced camper.

Swimming Lessons are required through Intermediate unless a parent makes other arrangements. Intermediate skills include swimming 50 yards of front crawl, elementary back stroke, breast stroke, side stroke, back crawl, survival float, treading water and diving. Endurance is also considered.

CAMP FOLEY assumes no liability for loss or damage to campers' personal property or for injury incurred as a result of use of personal property. Foley discourages all borrowing and lending among anyone living or working in camp. Campers may never use "special personal equipment" owned by other campers or staff such as: watercraft, skis, bows, rifles, musical instruments, aquatic equipment, or other items that are associated with specific risks (health, financial, accidents, etc.).

A list of names, addresses, and phone numbers of campers and staff will be printed for campers' use. Pictures are taken and used in camp promotion and fun mailings throughout the year. Upon request, your child can be excluded.

Personal property left by campers will be returned only upon request by parents, and at their expense. Expensive items when found and clearly marked, are returned.

Any money or valuables in the campers' possession upon arrival at camp may be deposited at the office for safe keeping. The camp assumes no responsibility for funds or valuables not so deposited.

Campers will be held responsible for damage to property and equipment caused by their negligence and will be charged accordingly for repairs or replacement.

We reserve the right to dismiss any camper whose conduct is harmful to the camp. It is understood and agreed, by camp and parents, that possession or use of tobacco, alcohol, or controlled substances while enrolled in camp can bring immediate dismissal.

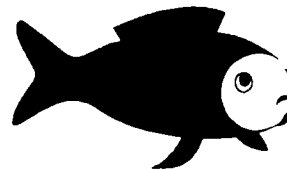
First Day Swim Qualification

Learning to swim is a valuable lifetime skill and safety on the water is a primary concern both at camp and throughout one's lifetime. Because campers typically spend at least half of their day at camp on or near the lake, testing gives us the security of knowing if they have the strength and composure to handle themselves in an emergency situation. Providing swimming instruction has two other benefits; it enhances the child's ability and helps improve their coordination. For these reasons, we test campers to either pass them out of swimming lessons or place them in the appropriate class according to their skill level.

In order for a camper to test out of swim lessons, they must possess Red Cross Intermediate swimming skills. The first part of the swim test will include a lifejacket check, watercraft safety information and a five minute interval of treading water to evaluate endurance. The second part is a stroke check. There are five strokes that will be tested; the front crawl, elementary backstroke, sidestroke, breaststroke, and back crawl. In order for a

camper to pass out of swim lessons, they must complete the five minute tread and be able to demonstrate complete proficiency in three out of the five strokes. Campers must also show adequate ability in the other two strokes.

All campers who have been to Foley in the past and have passed the intermediate skills test will not be required to retake the stroke check. Everyone else who has not completed that level of swimming at Camp Foley, both new and returning campers, will be tested. Notes from swim coaches and copies of certification from other aquatic facilities will be taken into consideration when evaluating camper's swimming abilities. We encourage parents and campers to send copies of awarded certifications to the camp office before the camper arrives. This prevents the originals from getting lost or damaged.

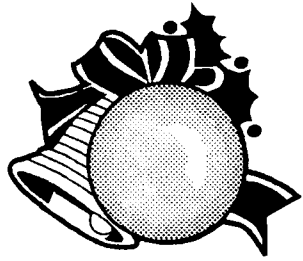

The Foley Journal of 1992

January 1 - Marie Schmid and Jeff Beltz, directors, along with their children, Alli and Peter, are celebrating this day at camp. The holidays are spent ice-skating on Whitefish Lake, sliding, cross-country skiing on the bike trails and snowmobiling on the camp property.

January 19 - The first Summer Camp Kickoff is held in St. Louis. It is the first of fourteen gatherings of old and prospective campers to discuss the fun and excitement of attending Camp Foley. Meetings will follow in Minneapolis, St. Paul, Chicago Area, Milwaukee, Fargo, Omaha, Des Moines, Denver, Dubuque, Duluth, Kansas City, and Colorado Springs.

February 3 - The first college campus recruitment day in search of qualified summer camp staff is held at Notre Dame. Foley will be at the following campuses by the end of March: St. Mary's in South Bend, Ohio Wesleyan University, University of Iowa, Iowa State University, University of Wisconsin - LaCrosse, University of St. Thomas, St. Mary's of Winona, and NE Missouri State. In addition personal interviews are scheduled with prospective staff from other campuses in the midwest.

February 23 - 29 - Marie attends the national conference of the American Camping Association in Albuquerque, New Mexico. It is a week of educational seminars geared toward camping professionals gathered from throughout the United States and foreign countries.

April 1 - DuWayne and Delores Johnson, Foley's caretakers are busy sanding and finishing the new beds for Wahtassa and Mingo. It is the beginning of a long range plan to replace all of the beds in camp. Each

year new beds will be built in two or three cabins.

May 2 & 3 - Fourteen couples from the surrounding area attend a premarriage seminar held at Foley. It is sponsored by the Catholic Diocese of Duluth.

May 4 - Marks the beginning of the Foley Environmental Education Program for sixth graders from Minnesota schools. In the four weeks that follow over 350 students, teachers and adult supervisors from thirteen Minnesota Catholic schools will spend four or five days at the Center. Time will be spent exploring the various ecosystems of the forest, pond, and meadow out at Echo Lake. Some of the students' experiences will include walking in muck, measuring tree circumferences, playing environmental games, studying pond water, planting trees, handling snakes and turtles, making homemade soap, whittling, canoeing in Hidden Lake, viewing the bald eagles, and completing orienteering courses set up in the woods.

June 14 - Staff arrive to prepare for the coming of our campers. They will spend ten days training in their activity areas, attending seminars, practicing emergency drills, and planning fun programs and events for the campers. Cold and rainy weather will spark creativity during this week. Staff will become proficient in rainy day programs!

June 24 - It is 2:32 p.m. and the first bus arrives into camp! Our staff enthusiastically welcomes our excited campers. Over 425 campers at various times will enjoy the traditional as well as the new creative events during their stay at Foley. Campers will join us from twenty three states, Mexico, Switzerland, France, and Spain before the

summer ends. All of the fun and craziness of summer camp is beginning.

June 25 - The numerous activities of camp come to life. Campers are off to the Marina for the fun and excitement of sailing, water-skiing, canoeing, boardsailing, and fishing. Shots are heard at the rifle range, balls are bouncing on the tennis courts and soccer field, arrows are flying toward their targets, laughter is heard in the woodworking shop and at the art class, and giggles abound from the volleyball and basketball courts. The swimmers and divers are braving the chilly water. (Minnesota will not break any record highs or experience a draught this summer!)

July 4 - Firecrackers awaken our campers on this Independence Day. The dining hall is decorated in red, white and blue. Campers will do the first Foley Pudding Slide and have a crazy time splattering shaving cream and flour on fellow campers. Following ice cream sundaes, campers are gathered on the swim dock to watch the fireworks. It will be a beautiful clear evening with the bright colors lighting up the sky, the stars shining overhead, and the sounds of laughter and ahs and ohs of our campers.

July 14 - Six campers and their leader are off to sail for four days on Lake Superior.

July 19 - Eight girls and two staff are off on a four day canoe making Foley history. It is the longest trip that our girls have participated in since coming to Foley in 1974. It is another step in bringing back Foley's once extensive tripping program. Two other four day canoe trips will depart. All campers staying two weeks or longer will go on an overnight with their cabinmates. Enthusiasm is high and wonderful memories are made.

July 25 - It is 1:00 p.m. and the sailboats are off! It is a beautiful site as our racers cross the starting line of the first race of the summer sponsored by the Whitefish Chain Yacht Club. On this day our campers are competing against each other and other sailors from the surrounding area. It will be a victorious day as Foley's skippers return with trophies and ribbons.

August 18 - It is almost noon and the last camper of the 1992 camping season departs with his parents. One notices the lack of entries in the journal from a busy and fun filled season. Memories of friends, final banquets, dances, crazy days, campfires, fun competitive days with other camps, soccer clinics, smores, rain, cabin activities, awards, skiing on the boom, mini car races, staff versus camper olympics, summer Halloween, sand volleyball, ultimate frisbee, mail call, birthdays, singing, silly games, swimming across the lake, giggles, laughter.... Where are all of those wonderful memories recorded? Hopefully forever in the minds of our 1992 campers. It was a summer of fun, friendships, new skills and experiences. The Foley spirit is absolutely wonderful.

August 19 & 20 - Bible Camp is in session with children from local churches.

September 3 - Kylie Marie Beltz is born. She will be the youngest camper at Foley in 1993.

November 15 - 150 campers are registered for 1993!

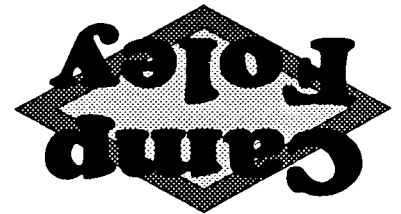

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Soda bread is still a favorite Sunday morning breakfast. The recipe is frequently requested and so we print it for all to enjoy.

SODA BREAD

4 cups flour
1 1/2 tbsp baking powder
1 1/8 cups sugar
1 1/2 tsp salt
2 eggs
1 1/2 cup milk or buttermilk
1 cup lard

Mix all ingredients together. Sprinkle with cinnamon and sugar.
Pour into a 8 1/2 X 11 cake pan. Refrigerate overnight.
Bake at 350 for 40 minutes.
