


Sailing Program

In 1974, "handicrafts" became two programs, Woodworking Shop and Art. Art, really crafts, was first located in a building behind the kitchen (now gone), up to the garage (now the girl's weight room), to picnic tables in the Center of camp, to the art tent (now gone) and back to Osawaka in the summer of '03. The program split again in '99 with Art becoming the painting, drawing, sketching and crafts.



Cabin Popcorn Night


Chat with an alumni of the 70's or 80's and see if they


Water Skiing



New Sailboats!

In the last newsletter we mentioned we were looking at replacing the Opti's with a new kind of boat. Great news, we have purchased six new boats that will be a blast for all our campers! They are Escape Mango's and they are so easy to rig and sail you'll be wanting to sail all day long! The sail stays on the boat all the time and simply rolls around the mast (like the Catalina's jib) so you don't need to spend any time putting the sail on. In fact all you need to do is just pop them in the water, pull out as much sail as you want and off you go! As you can see in the pictures they have one sail and can be sailed by one or two people. They are built to take lots of bumping and should offer many years of fun sailing!

New Boardsails!



LITs, CITs and Camp Knutson

This past summer at Foley introduced a new Leadership program that is designed to help anyone that is interested in learning more about how to lead groups of people. The campers that participated in the new LIT (Leader in Training) program as well as the revamped CIT (Counselor in Training) program impressed all of us who worked with them with their leadership, skills and devotion to trying new things. As part of the program, the groups got together with a group of participants from Camp Knutson, a neighboring camp that works with the mentally and physically challenged Each group did unique activities and overall, it was an incredible experience that will last in the minds of all that were involved for the rest of their lives.

Session 1: The first session group went to Camp Knutson to help out with an Autistic group of kids. Each member of our LIT and CIT program were matched up with a Camp Knutson staff member and assigned a station to run. Arts and crafts, demonstrations and many tactile events were available. Our LITs helped to create the crafts, do the demonstrations and mostly interact with the kids. Although it was a difficult group of kids to get to know on a personal level, the Foley group walked away with a better understanding of Autism and many personal memories!

Session 3: Once again we worked with individuals with skin ailments although this time they were a little older. The Foley kids created and performed their own campfires for the Knutson group and got to play host as Knutson came to Foley for an evening of Human Foosball, Giant Tetherball and a campfire. Once again the evenings went very well and the Foley group did an amazing job making the Knutson kids feel welcome.



Session 2: The second session kids braved the waters of Whitefish Lake and went over to Foley's Tipi Island. This

time, joining them from Camp Knutson, was a group of kids that had a variety of skin ailments. From slight to minor to major disorders including eczema, burns, to other major diseases. The Foley group prepared games, crafts and snacks for the Knutson group. The highlight of



the day was overwhelming the time spent just hanging out with the other kids and getting to know them.

Session 4: The final session found us back at Camp Knutson for probably our most energetic experience. The kids at Knutson this time were younger children that have gone through some sort of heart complications. Many of them have had multiple surgeries, hospitalizations and are on many different medications. The Foley kids once again teamed up with the Knutson staff and were in charge of a station. The first night that we went there, the group dressed up in costumes for the Halloween based evening. The following evening we returned to Knutson to help out with a modern Olympic themed evening.

"To have another camp visit that was so much dfferent than ours was so great. At first I was nervous to meet someone with a skin disease. But when I met them they were more normal than me. They had such high spirits and when that spirit mixed with ours there was an explosion of fun and joy and one of the most memorable times of my life!" Aaron Hellwig

"When Madi (Snyder) and were walking with some girls, I got to know a girl named Jill. It seemed like she was such a fun person...At the end she gave me a hug and told me how much fun she had."

Leaders in Training (LITs)





to sign their name on a sheet to help support Connor's goal. It was not required, but 416 signatures were added. Here is a web site that you can go to for more information:



Camp Foley and Youth Development

Over the last few years there has been a shift in the perception of what "camp" is and what it can do for the youth of today. There has been a realization that camp is much more than activities and in fact it is the human relationships or community that really have the most impact on the campers and staff that attend. If you are an older alumni, there was much more emphasis on developing the person and less on the skills one learned. The 80's and 90's saw a shift to the activities offered and there was less intentional growth of the person. No matter when you attended camp however, what most people remember is the relationships they had with other campers and staff.

We saw this change towards activities, and over the last four or five years have been making more of an effort to get back to being intentional about bringing out the best in the campers and helping them grow as people. In September 2003 when Jeff was at his American Camping Association's National Standards Commission meeting he met a woman from Youth Development Strategies, Inc (YDSI). YDSI is committed to helping youth serving organizations get better at meeting the developmental needs of youth, much like one tries to meet the developmental needs of an infant. The four main areas they measure are: Supportive Relationships, Safety,

Youth Involvement and Skill Building. In the past YDSI had only worked with community, school and church based youth organizations from across the country. In the summer of 2003, the American Camping Association (ACA) contacted YDSI and asked them to survey the youth at four camps. The results were stunning! Camps did far, far better in all areas compared to the other youth organizations, so much so in fact that YDSI wanted to find out why camps do so well. Last summer we contracted with YDSI to administer the survey in two of our sessions. We did very well! We, along with 19 other camps are now working hand in hand with both the ACA and YDSI to take the results of the survey and develop strategies that will be implemented next summer. The goal of course is to increase the effectiveness of what we do so we (camp) can truly make a contribution in the development of the campers we serve into becoming healthy, successful adults.

Although the activities at camp are an important part of the program, it is often the community spirit and close relationships that are remembered in the future. We hope the research from YDSI will better help us to aid the youth of today to become balanced, well rounded adults!

Schmid Family Update
