# Partnering with Parents!

## Social Computing... Real Internet Issues

**Social Networking, Cyberbullying, Facebook, MySpace, chat rooms, blogging.** Do you know what all those terms mean? They've been on the news and in the papers! Did we get your attention?

Our goal is to partner with our parents to protect our campers – your children. If you are a parent who has never visited a social networking site, you may want to go to [myspace.com](http://myspace.com) or similar site. If you have middle level or high school age children, ask them what they know about such sites. **There is a strong likelihood that your child, a classmate, a neighbor or a friend has a page on one or more of the social networking websites.** It is a means of communication and people of all ages can and are using these sites. When used in a positive manner, these sites can offer a great way of communication, self expression and information sharing. The danger lies with the interchange of personal information and information about others without their knowledge. Students are being suspended from school for “cyberbullying”, teens are meeting up with child predators that they have met on these sites, and the list goes on and on. As other groups, such as schools, churches and the media, urge you to educate and monitor your children, we too would like to partner with you in protecting our children.

We have made the following policy for the protection and privacy of campers, counselors and the extended Camp Foley community.

## Social Computing Policy

1. We prohibit the use of images (pictures or logos) of or from Camp Foley on social networking sites, public forums or web sites (including private domain names).
2. We prohibit the sharing of any personal information of campers or staff in public places on the Internet.
3. Staff, current and past, are not to allow any minors who have attended Camp Foley onto their sites (MySpace, Facebook or like) as “friends”.
4. We will be randomly visiting sites to monitor compliance and ask our camp community of campers, parents, counselors and alumni to inform us also.
5. We will notify staff or parents of campers if there is a violation of this policy.
6. We are working on specific courses of action that could for our counselors include firing or not rehiring, and for our campers not allowing admission to camp.

Foley's Code of Living challenges everyone in the camp community to live a lifestyle exhibiting high standards of moral character. We challenge our campers and counselors to continue living this way in their own communities when they leave camp. Unfortunately, many young people are not aware that other people outside their group of friends are seeing what is being transmitted. Things said in jest or to be cool are not interpreted the same way by everyone. A Foley counselor may have an appropriate page on Facebook but once added as a “friend” a camper's network expands to all of the staff members' “friends”, as well, where topics are not necessarily appropriate for minors. We are very appreciative of the support from our camp community thus far in upholding the strong ideals of Foley.

### Current-Day Challenges Parents Face

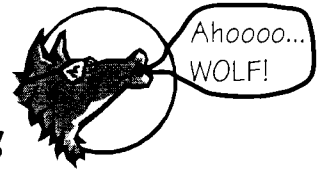

## Flick & Float '06

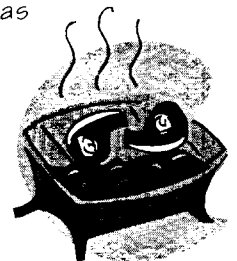

# Competitions and Old Favorites

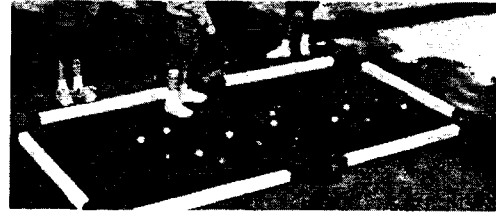
## Cup Stacking 101

## New Tennis Courts

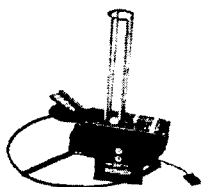
