

American mother discovers the wisdom of French parenting

American journalist Pamela Druckerman gives us a riveting glimpse into a calmer, rational way to raise children. Druckerman moved to Paris in 2002 with her British husband and soon after gave birth to their first child 'Bean'. Like most American parents (as well as most parents from around the world), Pamela and her husband quickly found their new jobs as parents were very tough jobs indeed. "We quickly discovered that having two restaurant meals a day with a toddler deserved to be its own circle of hell. Bean would take a brief interest in the food, but within minutes she was spilling salt shakers and tearing apart sugar packets." All this, however, didn't seem to be the case for the French! Pamela recounts French toddlers were sitting contentedly in these restaurants eating fish and even vegetables. "There was no shrieking or whining, and there was no debris around their tables."

Her exposure to the French culture showed time and time again that this wasn't the case for just meal times, either. "Why was it, for example, that in the hundreds of hours I'd clocked at French playgrounds, I'd never seen a child (except my own) throw a temper tantrum?" Her curiosity to this phenomenon, lead her to write Bringing Up Bébé: One American Mother Discovers the Wisdom of French Parenting.


Through curious investigation and observation of French parenting techniques, Pamela constructs a script designed to remove the perceived stress of raising children using techniques borrowed from our European cousins.

One of the secrets that Druckerman reveals in her book, she refers to as La Pause (The Pause) — which lends parents to treat babies as rational creatures, expected to "self-distract" in order to fall asleep. "An essential lapse in response time" which teaches children from a very young age the capacity to learn self-control.

Pamela has seen significant improvements in her own children's behavior as she adopts her findings into her childcare routines, attesting, "The French aren't perfect, but they have some parenting secrets that really work."

Summer camp also teaches children the effective skill of self-control. Although chiefly structured, camp gives children a myriad of choices and the opportunity to set their own schedules and make their own mistakes. This framework promotes learning from experiences and develops extremely focused and self confident individuals in the process.



This summer we had some new classes on the signup list. Our goal was to be able to offer something for everyone, with creativity being the name of the game! These activities included:




Please send your tax deductible donation to Camp Foley. Checks can be made to the "American Camping Association" and designated for the "Camp Foley Scholarship Program."

Camper Favorites

We asked our campers what their favorite activity was at Camp Foley in 2012, and the winners were: Waterskiing, Sailing, Riflery, Archery and Paintball! According to our survey, 95% of campers said they accomplished an activity goal and 97% reported having at least one Foley First!

Did you take or teach any of these classes during your time at Camp Foley? Do you remember other activites being popular while you were at camp?



Waterskiing:

Waterskiing was introduced to Camp Foley in 1956 with the purchase of a 30 horsepower boat. Since then, we've gone through many boat changes to increase horsepower for a better experience. The Disk was first used in 1960, and the booms came in 1992 and '93. Wakeskis and trick skis were purchased in 2007 and '08.





Sailing:

Foley's first record of a sailboat purchase was in 1946. Now you do NOT have to pass a swim test to take sailing, but in the 1950s sailing was only offered to intermediate swimmers and up. In 1956 Camp Foley won the first Foley/Lincoln Regatta. A Hobie Cat catamaran was added to the fleet in 1982 but was sold in 1987. In 1997 the Optimists (Optis) were added. Those were replaced in 2004 with the Escape Mangos. (The Mangos are now for sale! See below.)

Mangos for Sale!

We still have four Escape Mango sailboats for sale! These boats spent eight summers on Whitefish Lake. They were primarily used by our younger campers as an introduction to sailing. Riflery:

Riflery is the oldest of these top five activites. It came to Camp Foley way back in 1938. At that time, the Rifle Range was on the current boy's side by what is now Mandan/Kewas-kum. It's believed the range was moved to its current location sometime in the mid-50s. In 1975 the first ever boy-girl rifle meet took place, with the boys winning by only three points!





Archery:

In 1953 the Archery area was cleared and the building was added! The Archery Range began to take its current shape in 1966 when it doubled in size, adding moveable targets and the 60-foot nylon backdrop. In 2009 Camp Foley purchased deer, antelope and other various animal targets for campers to shoot.







Paintball:

Paintball is the newest of the top five activities by about 50 years, making its Foley debut in 2005 by camper-request. It hasn't gone through many changes since its arrival, but the course was revamped in '08 with more obstacles and hiding places. In 2013 campers will see new masks and markers!
