"Umuganda" - Coming Together

Alli was lucky enough to travel to **Rwanda** in March and was blown away by the generosity, humbleness, and work ethic of the Rwandan people. In a country with a history of violence, they have come together in the last two decades to create an atmosphere of giving, volunteerism, and community.

Every last Saturday of the month, all able bodied citizens between the ages of 18-65 spend 2 hours volunteering in their communities, in a day they call "Umuganda", which translates to "Coming Together". They pick up trash on the roads and trails, paint houses, help a neighbor who lost their farm to a mud slide, volunteer professional services like medical or dental care, and countless other acts that better their community.

And it works! The people of Rwanda are so committed to keeping their country clean they voted to outlaw plastic bags and when you drive around you rarely see trash on the ground. If they don't put it there, they don't have to pick it up at the end of each month.

So what does this have to do with camp? In the spirit of Umuganda, this summer we are going to have 1 block of time each session that will be dedicated to

community - both directly related to Foley and in our local area. Every camper, counselor, and director will participate in some way, giving us time to connect as a camp community and do something we can be proud of.

to enjoy some delicious bacon mac and cheered on a comical fashion show put on by the staff wearing their most impressive denim garb. It was a riot of a good time!










Safari: Sessions 2 & 4

token to always cherish the memories made each individual summer. All campers and staff are issued a name tag and lanyard, which then becomes a proud host for these pins.



2012 saw the implementation of **Club Paradise**, a way to say 'thank you' to those families that referred new families to Foley. Now, 5 years later and heading into our **6th summer** installment, Club Paradise has been through a few face-lifts and changes, with our most recent update of Club Paradise being the execution of **Camp Credit** last summer. Under the new Club Paradise referral program you earn what we call Camp Credit. Families that refer a new family and get a child to register, earn this Camp Credit, which is **10% of tuition** paid by that new family! In addition the new family that was referred and registers a first time camper also receives a 10% credit, making this opportunity **beneficial to both parties**. The Camp Credit amount then becomes flexible dollars for you

to use how you choose. If you were the refered family, you can use the Camp Credit towards your tuition for the next summer. However, if you were the family that refered a new family, you can either use the credit towards next summer's tuition, receive it back in the form of a check, or donate the amount to our Scholarship Fund! Last summer we had 60 families refer a new family to Camp and 18 of them chose to donate their Camp Credit to our Scholarship Fund.
