95th Summer of Adventures

Our Historic 95th Summer was full of skill development, friendships, memories and ultimately, for our campers, the chance to leave a lasting legacy in the storied tradition of Camp Foley. Each session, after our Founder's Day meal, we held a special "95" challenge. These challenges incorporated the numerical value of 95 as well as some level of spirited competition. Below is a recap of what each session did for our 95th Summer of Adventures.

1st Session

Campers during 1st Session were given the option to complete a 95 song challenge. Specifically, they had to sing 95 DIFFERENT choruses to any camp song or jingle. There were 104 total campers that successfully participated in the challenge. The official time it took to sing all 95 choruses... 27 min 19 sec!



2nd Session

This session was full of different challenges for campers to compete in such as 95 minutes of nonstop piano playing, 95 minutes of continuously treading water, 95 leap frogs, 95 passes of a ball 20 feet apart, 95 free throws, 95 jumping jacks,

95 seconds of balancing on a slackline, 95 points in Archery using 12 arrows and 95 "upsies" and "downsies" with a tennis ball and racket. Campers could rotate challenges or stay at one for the whole time.



3rd Session

Two 9 minute and 50 second scavenger hunts awaited 3rd Session campers. One hunt was for outside items and the other was for items inside the cabin only! Energy was high as each cabin raced against the clock to gather all of the items on the list. Scavenger hunts have been a



big part of Foley programming throughout the years and it was fun to incorporate them again.

4th Session

A classic camp game made its way back as each cabin sent a representative up to determine their evening program through the method of horsengoggle (Google it!). Winners then challenged another cabin to an evening program like volleyball, baseball, basketball, human foosball and others for a 95 minute battle!


















A long awaited dream was realized as we purchased a brand new



Camp Foley is always looking to provide additional and appropriate training for our Staff. Enter Mental Health First Aid (MHFA). Mental health is becoming more and more important and we are finding having the ability to best serve mental health concerns is a crucial part of being able to run a quality camp. This past June, 7 staff members went through an 8 hour course to become Mental Health First Aiders. These staff were trained to understand, identify and respond to someone experiencing mental health challenges. Mental Health First Aid did not teach them to be therapists but rather how to provide initial help until appropriate professional resources are available. And a big shout out to Foley's Director, Alli, for being certified as a MHFA instructor and teaching this course!

Alli Won the Sue Tinker Award



problems and Alli came to the rescue in Foley's pontoon boat! Quite the adventure and special moment for Mary Ella and her family. She will be missed.

1934-1941

Father Foley made a promise that if camp thrived, he would build a chapel at camp.

Camp was successful and construction began in 1934. Our Lady of the **Snows** celebrated its first Mass on August 5 (the feast day for Our Lady of the Snows) in 1937. Two years later, Batman made his debut in DC Comics. Detective Comics #27. And while things were going well for Father Foley at camp, on Sunday morning, December 7th, 1941, Pearl Harbor in Honolulu, Hawaii was attacked by Japanese forces and America officially joined the fight in World War II.



2009 - Marie's daughter, Alli Faricy, officially joined Camp Foley as a Director, after many years as a camper and counselor. In January of that year, Barak Obama was sworn in as the first black president of the United States, and Avatar became the highest grossing movie of all time, until it was unseated 10 years

later by **Avengers**: Endgame.

95 Years... A Lot Has Happened!


Camp Foley has been around since 1924, in that year gas was only 11 cents a gallon! Did you know that Camp Foley is older than SLICED BREAD? It wasn't invented until 1928, four years after camp started. Camp Foley has been through many of the historical milestones that define our country. Follow the timeline to see some of the historical milestones that have happened in 95 years!

1924 - Camp was established by **Father John Foley**. The camp only had five buildings and was using cabin Kildare as the camp chapel. Calvin Coolidge was president and The Great Gatsby, considered one of the great American novels, was

published in 1925.



1949 - A bia change came for camp. Bob Schmid, a former Foley camper and counselor, purchased the camp in 1949 from Father Foley. He changed the name from Father Foley's Camp for Boys to



Just one year after Bob took over Camp Foley, color tv was invented!

1970's - Camp Foley was in session during the July 1969 moon landing. In 1971, the first personal **computer** was made available for a whopping \$750. A year prior to when the Vietnam War would end, Bob and Vi Schmid allowed airls to attend Camp Foley for the first time in 1974. This decision would change the dynamic of Foley forever and give so

many more people the chance to experience camp.



battery died. Two years later in 1985 our current Director, Marie **Schmid**, took over ownership of Camp Foley. Back to the Future came out in the summer of Marie's first year, and it spent 11 weeks at number one and grossed \$389.1 million worldwide.





The Future - we look forward to see what is added to this timeline. Just imagine what's going to happen in the next 95 years!

Silver Paddle Award
